

- Awarded an athletic scholarship to compete on the University's gymnastics team for 5 years where she learned discipline, communication skills, and how to be a team player









 - Justification for requests must be provided to address gaps (CAT, exercise AAR, or HVA/risk assessments)









Drug Shortages Report Conclusions

- No simple solution
- Root causes involve economic factors driven by private & public sector decision-making
- Important to consider the true costs of shortages and their effects on patients and the heath care system
- Recognize and reward quality manufacturing to incentivize companies
- Change how drugs are paid for, including contracting changes, to enable generic manufacturers to charge sustainable prices

Hospitals and healthcare facilities face a unique set of challenges in an active shooter incident. These incidents have no patterns in victim selection or method, creating an unpredictable and quickly evolving situation that can lead to loss of life and injury. Numerous factors associated with hospital and healthcare environments complicate traditional response to active shooter incidents, including the "duty-to-care", also known as "duty-to-act", commitment and the varying levels of patient mobility and patient special needs. Additionally, staff must consider response planning for patients that require the greatest allocation of resources, as well as the unique characteristics within the hospital and healthcare environment.

Potential Indicators

Healthcare facilities are open, healing environments with limited restricted access areas such as the emergency department, Intensive Care Unit, behavioral health, and radiology. Since active shooter events occur with little or no warning, response requires significant thoughtful planning and preparation, taking into account an ordanization energing and unlorabilities critical for an offective.




Nuclear Sites Affecting GA


- 6 GA counties (4%) and 2 GA hospitals are within the 10 mile radius of a nuclear plant










Outbreak of Lung Injury Associated with E-Cigarette Use or Vaping



HEALTH ADVISORY

Imminent Health Risks of Electronic Cigarettes and Vaping Devices

10/9/19

The Georgia Department of Public Health is issuing this health advisory to inform the public of the imminent health risks posed by electronic cigarettes or other vaping devices. Serious lung injuries, and in some cases death, have been linked to e-cigarettes or other vaping devices and the vaping products used in them. The Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) and state health departments are investigating, but the specific cause of the lung injuries remains unknown.

- Thirty-three deaths have been confirmed in 24 states
- THC is present in most of the samples tested by FDA to date, and most patients report a history of using THC-containing products



 - 515 hospitalizations
- Mostly in north Georgia, Augusta & metro Atlanta
- Commissioner Toomey and Dr. Drenzek sent out a letter on 4/24 regarding this outbreak





WHO Declares Ebola Outbreak in DRC

a Public Health Emergency of National Concern

7/17/19

- HHS/ASPR CIP and interagency PPE-specific supply chain readiness calls with manufacturers, distributors, and other healthcare supply chain partners are underway
- CDC activated its <u>Emergency Operations Center</u> (EOC) on June 13, 2019 to support the inter-agency response to the outbreak

Recommendations for Healthcare Personnel

- Ask about patients' travel histories
- Consider the possibility of EVD in patients who present with fever and severe headache, fatigue, muscle pain, vomiting, diarrhea, abdominal pain, or unexplained bleeding (e.g., bleeding gums, nose bleeds)
- Check the Travel Clinical Assistant for up to date information on current travel-related diseases: <u>https://dph.georgia.gov/TravelClinicalAssistant</u>





Recommendations for Healthcare Personnel


- If the patient reports a history of recent travel to one of the outbreak areas in DRC and have consistent symptoms, immediately call 1-866-PUB-HLTH (1-866-782-4584) and ASK SPECIFICALLY to SPEAK WITH a DPH Medical Epidemiologist for consultation
- The Med Epi will conduct a risk assessment and facilitate next steps as appropriate, for example, engaging the Infectious Disease Network (IDN)

Omnibus Burden Reduction (Conditions of Participation) Final Rule CMS-3346-F

- Emergency program
 - Decreased requirements to conduct an annual review of emergency program to biennial review
 - Long term care (LTC) facilities will continue to review their emergency program annually
- Emergency plan
 - No longer requires documentation of efforts to contact local, tribal, regional, State and federal EP officials
 - No longer requires documentation of participation in collaborative and cooperative planning efforts





Omnibus Burden Reduction (Conditions of Participation) Final Rule CMS-3346-F

- Training
 - Training requirement decreased from annually to every 2 years
 - Nursing homes still required to provide annual training
- Testing (for inpatient providers/suppliers)
 - One of 2 annually-required testing exercises may be an exercise of the facility's choice
- Testing (for outpatient providers/suppliers)
 - Requires only 1 testing exercise annually instead of 2
